Marx from the Perspective of Modernity: Logical Critiques of Modernity and the Shaping of Historical Materialism

On Marx's Three Uncompleted Plans of Critique

Abstract: The shaping of historical materialism overlapped the logical collapse of the thought of modernity. In this sense, the early change of Marxist thought is of dual significance to the history of thought; that is, it is both the basis of understanding historical materialism and the medium for perceiving the collapse of the thought of modernity. Marx's three early uncompleted plans of critique—critique of Hegel's philosophy of law, critique of national economics, and critique of ideology, kept a record of the transitions from exploration of reason to that of labor and to that of the premise of material production. At the level of macro history of thought, the changes reveals the transitions from external form to internal structure, from eschatological concern to concern over material life.
